

## CAMP TRAINING TO ATTRACT 70

Course to Be Given  
at Tannadoonah  
June 14-17.

More than 70 reservations from middle western states have been received in South Bend Camp Fire Girls' headquarters for a national camp training course which will be conducted June 14 to 17 at Camp Tannadoonah, the local council's reservation on Birch lake, near Vandalia, Mich.

Tannadoonah was selected from among more than 100 camps. Eleven similar institutes will be held over the country. The program will be typical of regular camp activities and Miss Dorothy Brown, local executive secretary and camp director, will be the official hostess. Miss Edith M. Kempthorne and Miss Ruby Lettimore, of national headquarters, New York city, will direct the course, with the assistance of Miss Catherine Lee Wahlstrom and Miss Ruth Kemp, also of the national staff.

Miss Dorothy Treat, of the Cleveland, O., Museum of National History, will direct nature lore study. She will be assisted by Miss Margaret Johnson, Cleveland. Local persons who will help with the course are Mrs. Norris Mann, who will direct singing, and Miss Elizabeth Dutton, in charge of camp craft. Miss Patricia Hillard, Tannadoonah nurse, will be the nurse in charge for the training course. She will be assisted by Miss Ruth Kemp of the nature aft and honor department. Handcraft will be in charge of Tannadoonah hand craft counselors, Miss Irene Carruthers, Otumwa, Ia., Miss Mary Elizabeth Jones, Indianapolis, and Miss Bertha Coburn.

Prof. Louis L. Hasley, of the University of Notre Dame, will have charge of a session on poetry and Miss Lulu V. Cline, head of health education in the school city of South Bend, will continue a health session in the course.
